

One of the study offerings during this Lenten season is an opportunity to dig deeply into *The Book of Common Prayer* (BCP), those books with the red covers that sit next to the hymnals in the pew racks. We meet between the services starting around 9:20 a.m. and ending by 10 TODAY and



continuing on Sundays, March 10<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>. There will be coffee! TODAY we will focus on the two different communion services; Rite 1 and Rite 2, In the third session the focus will be on the daily "offices," Morning and Evening Prayer. The final session will be about the

abundance of prayers that are found in the last part of the book. It isn't necessary to attend all the sessions; each can stand alone. Join us as you are able!

Each station will be represented by artwork, poetry, and a traditional prayer. The art and writings are the accumulation of prayerful work done over months by our parishioners who have graciously given their time towards this project. Lenten Fridays at 5:30 pm will be an opportunity to see their visions and interpretation of the Stations while reflecting on the Lenten season in prayer, fasting and almsgiving. If you can't join us on Friday evenings the Stations will be in the parish hall throughout the weeks of Lent for you to enjoy and ponder. We will not hold Compline on Fridays during Lent.

**Devotionals for Lent:** We are again making a prayer/devotional resource available for the parishioners' use for the holy season of Lent. Our devotions come from Episcopal Relief and Development and the Episcopal Church (USA). The devotionals utilize a combination of scripture and reflection as we are invited to contemplate issues of justice, reconciliation (both from personal sin and social change/challenge), and how to strengthen our faith.
