United Action of Connecticut (UACT) is an organization that St. Mark's has supported since its inception. On Wednesday, June 15th UACT held its 14th Annual Justice Celebration at Beth Shalom Rodfe Zedek in Chester. I am pleased to report that St. Mark's had a good turnout with Norm & Sue Holland, Stephen Hard & Mark Giuliatti, and Marjola & Len Nelson attending.

UACT is an interfaith, multi-racial, multi-lingual organization of congregations and community institutions crossing political, economic and urban/suburban boundaries.

UACT's MISSION is the building of powerful, broad-based community organizations rooted in faith and social justice values, working to make concrete improvements in the lives of families and individuals. By identifying and developing leaders and by organizing around well-defined, winnable issues, UACT enables people to understand their own power and to acquire the skills and allies necessary to exercise power collectively and effectively. United Action seeks to strengthen local congregations, and through them to bring regions together and find common ground for the common good.

UACT's GOALS are strengthening congregations to grow and thrive; developing leaders through intensive training and practical organizing experience that is systematically evaluated and reflected upon; and moving congregations and communities into effective public action for the common good.

Membership in UACT, of which St. Mark's has been a member since its inception, has included Catholic, Community, Episcopal, Jewish, Unitarian Universalist congregations, among others in disparate towns and cities such as Chester, Meriden, Middletown, New Britain, Niantic and Plainville.

Issues that UACT has and is working on include Health and Mental Health Care, Immigration and Domestic Worker Justice. Manos Unidas, a group that met at St. Mark's at 147 West Main St., is a group which worked on immigration reform relevant to the Hispanic community and DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) protection.

Contemporary Collects and Prayers

August 21 - Grant, O merciful God, that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples, to the glory of your Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

August 28 - Lord of all power and might, the author and giver of all good things: Graft in our hearts the love of your Name; increase in us true religion; nourish us with all goodness; and bring forth in us the fruit of good works; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Summer Reading

How about a pair of books to rev up your social justice juices? Start with The Nickel Boys by Colton Whitehead, a fictional introduction to the Dozier School for Boys in the panhandle town of Marianna, Florida. There is good character development, you will become connected to the boys and cringe at their treatment.

Pair that with We Carry Their Bones by Erin Kimmerle. Her story of the search for graves of the Dozier School boys is an excellent description of the actual practice of forensic anthropology. The School stated there were 31 boys buried on campus. After extensive research, 51 graves were found, many without markers, without death certificates, with families not notified before they were buried. Then there was the situation of how do you memorialize found Dozier boys, Black or white? The school was closed in 2011 after 111 years of operation but town residents were not critical of its practices as the school was where residents earned their livings.

Justice that needed to be faced - Justice not easy to face.


