"Let us pray."

Those words can be so embracing, so soothing. But there are times when they simply remind us that we don't have time to pray - not the way we long to. We want to pray without ceasing.

Still, the call to prayer is strong. The call to pray throughout the day has sounded for centuries as a way to deepen our faith. Sometimes we ask God for a special intention through prayer, sometimes we pray for forgiveness, sometimes we pray in thanksgiving but prayer sustains us regardless of how, where, why, or in what form we pray. People in all kinds of religious traditions, including Judaism and Christianity, have been marking time with prayer for almost as long as we've had hours. "Praying the hours," as it's called, has always reminded us that God walks with us throughout each day; "praying the hours" is also a way that the community of faith comes together, whether we're all in one place or scattered like raindrops. Praying at set hours links us, both to God and to all God's people. We know this, and we are comforted. And remember....when we gather Sunday mornings and sing our entrance song, sequence hymn, and dismissal hymn, or any time for that matter...."(s)he who sings prays twice!"

Our service will always be available on Zoom with Meeting ID 500-865-037. You can enter via the parish Web link at http://www.stmarksnewbritain.org. Please either print or have the bulletin open on a separate browser tab to participate fully in the service. (For more information on the Zoom service, please go to the back page of the bulletin.)

If there is a significant negative change in the trajectory of the Covid-19 pandemic, we will switch to Zoom-only worship. An email will be sent out to the parish to alert everyone if the service is to be Zoom only.

In-person services at 90 Main Street <u>will no longer require</u> that everyone wear a mask and maintain a safe distance inside the buildings of South Church. Please use your best judgement concerning mask use if you have been exposed to someone who tested positive. Masks will be available for those who need them. Thank you.

BISHOP-ELLECT GIFT FUND

It is customary for the people of the diocese welcoming a new bishop to join in giving the new bishop various signs of the episcopal office and vestments they will use in their ministry. We are honored to be gifting Bishop-elect Jeff with his episcopal ring and purple set of vestments to be used during Advent and Lent on parish visitations.

The vestments are being designed and made by vestment artisan Patrick Boylan, out of Brooklyn, New York. The set will include a chasuble, two priest stoles and a deacon's stole. It will be accompanied by a plain white miter, the customary choice of miter for the Advent and Lenten seasons.

The episcopal ring is a traditional signet ring. It will feature the diocesan seal (in reverse) on its face and will be used to create wax seals. One side of the ring will have engraved on it an ox yoke, an important symbol from the Bishop-elect's years spent in ministry at the Episcopal Conference Center in Pascoag, RI. The other side of the ring will feature a nutmeg branch, in reference to Connecticut as "The Nutmeg State." Together, they remind the Bishop-elect where his ministry began, and where it has sent him to serve.

The total cost of these gifts is \$12,000. Every gift amount is welcomed, no matter how big or small. We thank you for your generosity in welcoming our new bishop diocesan to the Episcopal Church in Connecticut!

Dear Faithful of St. Mark's:

This Sunday we welcome to St. Mark's our Regional Missionary, Maggie Breen. Father Pace will be our celebrant and homilist, but Maggie will be joining us for our regular coffee time following services to discuss all issues regional. This meeting is especially timely for us as the following Sunday (October 2) we commence our visiting of local parishes with an eye to merging. Maggie, obviously, is very familiar with all the parishes in our area and should be able to provide valuable insights. I hope as many as possible will join us for this important conversation in Cooper Hall following our services on Sunday.

On October 2 we will be celebrating the Eucharist with the community of St. James in Farmington. Please remember that on the visitation Sundays we will not be having services at 90 Main, although remote participation will be available for those who cannot attend in person. Two things, in particular, need to be noted. The first is that the time of the services at the parishes we will be visiting varies. The service at St. James, for instance, starts at 10:15 a.m. The second thing to keep in mind is that on the Sunday following our visit to any parish, the visit will be the focus of our conversation during coffee time the following Sunday at 90 Main Street.

We are in transition! That is unsettling for everyone, but change is more difficult for some than for others. In all of this, besides God's presence with us, there is something else that is certain.

Nothing is going to happen fast! Holding one's breath is not recommended.

- ♦ Welcome to October and crisp, chilly autumn air! I am missing the relaxing warmth of summer days, but I realize that this season is invigorating. St. Mark's is following suit and beginning its parish visits to seek a new partner in our community mission. Elsewhere in the message is a schedule showing the dates, parishes, times and online alternatives for the visits. Updates will be provided as information becomes available. Thanks to Barbara Campbell, we have supply priests for most of our Sundays at 90 Main St. She and Stephen will lead worship otherwise. We are working hard to find a priest for Christmas Eve or Christmas Day.
- ♦ South Church has relaxed its mask-wearing and disinfecting requirements within the building. More activities will take place, but we are still not having large groups for meals and mingling.
- ◆ Fifth Sundays are resuming. The first will be Oct.30th at 11 a.m. in South Church's main sanctuary, and all the 90 Main church groups are invited to take part. Specific plans are in process.
- ◆ St. Mark's Community Ministries Committee will be looking at an opportunity to work with UACT to provide support services for refugees settling in New Britain.
- ♦ Finally, I want to share with you this quote from Reinhold Niebuhr, an American Reformed theologian, which Rev. Diana Rogers used in one of her sermons a couple of weeks ago. It really touched my heart.

"Nothing worth doing is completed in our lifetime; therefore we must be saved by hope. Nothing true or beautiful makes complete sense in any immediate context of history; therefore we must be saved by faith. Nothing we do, however virtuous, can be accomplished alone; therefore, we are saved by love."

May the Holy Spirit continue to support and guide us in God's way, in God's time.
