Yes, the Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, both Bishops of the Diocese of Massachusetts, the Bishop of Maine, the Bishop of the New England Synod, Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, and both Bishops of Connecticut had specific roles in the consecration. And at least 16 other Bishops dressed up, processed and "just attended".

If you see online the sermon preached by The Rev. Canon Meaghan Brower, Director of the Episcopal Church Camp in Rhode Island, sit down and listen to it! We laughed with her through out the sermon and really appreciated a sermon on "Joy".

Cultural changes of note were the Land Acknowledgement statement and flute solo respecting the 10,000 years of Indigenous people who lived in this part of the Connecticut valley.

The Lord's Prayer and the Gospel were read in Spanish, Haitian Creole, and English. The Expansive Language Version of Eucharistic Prayer B was used. The readers for the first and second lessons were middle school young.

The Rev. Tuesday Rupp and the Rev. Robert Bergner as cantors did beautiful jobs singing alternate verses of the Litany for Ordinations.

After seeing the hands on the head of Bishop Mello, it was grand to see him put on red vestments and really look like a Bishop as he celebrated the Eucharist.

Appreciation to Stephen Hard as he worked with The Rev. Ron Kolonowski on Space and Logistics - getting the neon cross upright and lit, and getting the matching cathedras for the altar.

And my favorite steel drums from St. Luke's, New Haven were played!

Contemporary Collects and Prayers

November 1 - All Saint's Day - O Almighty God, who have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship, in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord: Give us grace so to follow your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those indescribable joys which you have prepared for those who truly love you: through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, in glory everlasting.

November 13 - Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: Grant us so to hear them, read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them, that we may embrace and ever hold fast the blessed hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Savior Jesus Christ; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

November 20 - Christ the King - Almighty and everlasting God, whose will it is to restore all things in your well-beloved Son, the King of kings and Lord of lords: Mercifully grant that the peoples of the earth, divided and enslaved by sin, may be freed and brought together under his most gracious rule; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

November 27 - The First Sunday of Advent - Almighty God, give us grace to cast away the works of darkness, and put on the armor of light, now in the time of this mortal life in which your Son Jesus Christ came to visit us in great humility; that in the last day, when he shall come again in his glorious majesty to judge both the living and the dead, we may rise to the life immortal; through him who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

Welcome to November! It is a season of Thanksgiving and the beginning of a new year of Stewardship. Some days it seems impossible to give thanks. News is filled with political mayhem, war, human suffering and climate change destroying our planet. Costs are rising ---- how can I stretch my pennies to give more to worthy causes? Yet, how can I not? I am thankful for God's Love. It is *always* there in the midst of turmoil and celebrations. God's love is within each one of us. Let us share it with each other and the world. Stewardship letters and pledge cards will be mailed this month for your prayerful consideration.

We have visited 2 of our "merger candidates" during October---St. James', Farmington and Grace Newington. I found both very welcoming. St. James' reminded me of St. Mark's 10-15 years ago when we still had our building, activities, outreach and children! Grace has a tight group of faithful believers hanging on as St. Mark's is. Our next visits will be at St Paul's Southington on Nov. 6th (Holy Eucharist), St. Gabriel's East Berlin on Nov. 20th (Morning Prayer) and St. James', West Hartford on Dec. 4th (Lessons & Carols, Holy Eucharist). We have not been able to find a supply priest for Christmas, but St. Gabriel's will be having a Christmas service. We are thinking of joining them.

Barbara (Committee chair) and the Community Ministries Committee are considering multiple options to help those in need in New Britain with our Smith Fund. Our Food Pantry will be self-sufficient through June 2023 with deliveries from Food Share at no charge and the food donations from area grocery stores collected faithfully by Mark Giulietti. We must give thanks to our volunteers too. However, funds are needed for a possible Morning Mingle, Home Heating Assistance, and special grants for individuals. Vestry voted to give a \$10K grant to UACT to aid refugees settling in New Britain.

Last but not least, it is time to nominate yourself or another willing candidate to serve on St. Mark's Vestry! All positions are open. Please help St. Mark's give to our treasured community.
