THE LION'S PAUSE with STEPHEN HARD, JUNIOR WARDEN

Dear St. Mark's Parishioners:

What a year! We've seen the slow winding down of the global pandemic, the election and installation of Bishop Mello (masked, but in person), and, in general, the continuation of our life in Christ sans regular clergy. We also restarted serious exploration of merging with another Episcopal congregation after being waylaid by COVID-19. Through all the vicissitudes, I have tried to make my thinking clear. As followers of Jesus and stewards of our Savior's Church, we do not look solely to our own comfort, but we try to understand how both individually, and as a community of believers, we can best serve Our Lord and the mission of the Church. That, of course, means being forward looking. Christians are focused on the future, what is to come. Christmas illustrates this perfectly. We commemorate with great joy the birth of Our Savior in a stable in Bethlehem while we anticipate and prepare for the promised second coming.

So where do we go from here? Some individuals have voted with their feet (and wallets!). We who remain need to prayerfully discern what is best for us, and for the mission of Christ. I have made no secret that I see a merger with a stronger Episcopal congregation as the best and most responsible way for us to see that our human and financial assets can continue to serve the mission of Jesus in New Britain and beyond. January 15 - Almighty God, whose Son our Savior Jesus Christ is the light of the world: Grant that your people, illumined by your Word and Sacraments, may shine with the radiance of Christ's glory, that he may be known, worshipped, and obeyed to the ends of the earth; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

January 22 - Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

January 29 - Almighty and everlasting God, you govern all things both in heaven and on earth: Mercifully hear the supplications of your people, and in our time grant us your peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen.*

Merry Christmas! Happy New Year! Advent began a new church year. Likewise, we have turned the page into a new calendar year, 2023. I'm placing bets on how many times I write the wrong date!

St. Mark's is also turning a corner in its path into the future. We have completed our 5 visits to nearby episcopal parishes. A survey has been sent out asking for parish input on next steps. Should we merge? Which parish? Are there other options? Our last parish vote favored a merger. Vestry is moving forward on that assumption (but still welcomes comments). Pending survey results, we will inform our bishops of our merger choice, and they will inform that parish. And the long process begins leading to parish votes and eventual approval at a future CT Diocesan convention. Please respond to the survey by Jan 15th!

Our Annual meeting is February 5th in Cooper Hall after our 10:00 a.m. service in Erwin Chapel. Zoom will be available for those who can't attend in person. The agenda includes vestry elections and possibly merger discussions and post-pandemic pastoral care without a priest. Thanks to our nominating committee, we have vestry candidates for 2 years, but there are still openings. Please consider joining the St. Mark's team!

St. Mark's has approved more Smith Fund expenditures. The latest is \$10K to Coram Deo Recovery which operates several recovery houses in New Britain. Their mission is to support women recovering from abuse and addiction. Our largest donations have been to the Friendship Service Center to help build the new Hope Connection Center on Arch Street. December 21st is the grand opening and ribbon cutting. *(The opening was postponed to February 2023)* It will be a centralized place for the homeless to obtain access to multiple services to help them rebuild their lives.
